I. City of Ventura Report by Peter Brown

July 25 update to Council. Meeting July 7, of subcommittee. Agenda: discussion on possible ordinance on shopping carts; Aug 20 job fair; update from Gateway committee.

Money has been dispensed for VSSTF grants

Meeting was held between business owners and VPD re undesirable activity on the pier. Decrease in pan handling downtown (probably because of increased police presence downtown, many persons have moved to pier area. Negative impact on tourists.

A meeting was held with Behavioral Health: excellent productive collaboration, discussion on Homeless 2Home , case management focus, ACT direction, and related projects.

Moving toward formal agreement with Patagonia and the City, have begun talks with Common Ground. Patagonia will underwrite costs for Common Ground to come to Ventura for training. Very exciting development. Huge kick off meeting coming soon. VPD contact is Dave Wilson (dwilson@ci.ventura.ca.us)

Housing Element coming before Council July 18. No extensive discussion foreseen, for better or worse. Housing Trust Fund was approved for \$200,000 over 5 years. This is money that will be matched by the State.

II. Report from Jill Martinez and Tim Hawkins from Community Action Program of Ventura County

The Les Goldberg property on Thompson, (near Kalorama) Project starting to fizzle, possibly because of lack of involvement in Ventura. Decision made by Board to not continue plans at this time, even though they received EHAP grant in June 2010 of one million. Tim and Jill outlined the work Community Action does, including assisting a large population of Ventura residents.

III. Committees

A. Faith Based by Rob Orth

Thanksgiving: committee to be formed for OneCityOne Meal planning. Include Jim Rice, Jesse Giglio, Bill Finley, John Jones, Haroldale Cartlidge, Donna Mason or Debora Schreiber, Rotary rep (possibly Indy Batra), who else?

Project Understanding update: they are doing case management with 8 clients toward getting them housed. Received a United Way Grant to train people to provide rental assistance case management, and budgeting.

Possibility/idea to convene a church and provider based meaning to discuss movement toward Hand Up Not Hand Out concept and concerns, collaboration and accountability. Jim Duran and Bill Finley will move forward with preliminary plans.

VSSTF Candidate Forum to be on a Thursday eve in late September.

Announcement: Rev. McCurtiss of Total Life Christian is having a job fair on Aug 20 at Plaza Park, geared toward low skill applicants. Goal is 6-10 employers to have tables there. Would be helpful to contact or suggest employers to attend. Suggestion made of Sam Hishmeh from Domino Pizza, Neal will follow up.

May Stewart noted that at Foster Library a volunteer helps professional job seekers with their resumes. 29 clients have been assisted; 9 people have found jobs,

B. Ventura Homeless Prevention Fund Cindy Cantle

Catholic Charities has the VHPF for June. In May, Project Understanding assisted 4 households. Total allocated \$3,505, or an average of \$876 per household. Total number of households assisted 185. June Donations - \$402 by Ventura Missionary

Business Cards – Beth will have business cards printed up with logo and contact information so that committee members can provide info quickly to potential donors.

Homeless Prevention Week: Discussion and planning for activities during November (Homeless Prevention Month). We have budget of \$6,000. Goals – Education about Prevention and Raise Funds for VHPF.

Gateway to be case managed, not open

drop in. No summer public meetings to be held. City Community Development Dept and VPD working also with committee attempting to get unified message. The city is not part of team officially.

III. Report from Jerome Holt re turning a City parking lot into a park and storm water mitigation system in Midtown. Concerns re homeless congregating in park and negative activities have been raised. Location is behind Pizza hut and Laundromat between Harmon and Katherine. 30,000sq feet of asphalt to be removed. Discussion.

IV. One Stop Kate Mills

Increase in population and mixed demographic. More families, those recently out of jail, single women.

V. New Business

Proposal/motion/concept: shelter is a basic human right. Idea to put this fact forward to City Council concerning both Emergency Shelter and supportive housing. We as a community consider food and shelter basic human rights...tie in to Gateway. Should we decide on a list of basic rights and vote. Possibly add to mission statement. Much discussion. (Notes: Word..."housing" possibly problematic. Housing is a basic human right. Housing...a basic right. Access to appropriate housing... Consult UN language; legal city lawsuit language?) No resolution reached.
