THE ARCH VENTURA

This year marks five years since The ARCH opened its doors in Ventura—a milestone made possible by decades of dedication from the local community. For over 20 years, passionate advocates, faith leaders, and business owners pushed for the creation of an emergency shelter to serve Ventura's unhoused neighbors. Their efforts culminated in a partnership with Mercy House, following a visit to our Orange County sites that sparked a shared vision for compassionate care.

Since opening, The ARCH has become a cornerstone of support in Ventura. We're deeply grateful for the ongoing trust and collaboration from the City and local residents. With their support, we've expanded our services and continue to grow—not just in Ventura, but throughout the county. Here's to five years of impact—and to the many more ahead.

OXNARD NAVIGATION CENTER

We're excited to announce the upcoming opening of Casa de Carmen—a brand new, purpose-built facility that will soon welcome clients from the Oxnard Navigation Center into a space designed specifically to meet their needs.

For years, the armory building has served as a temporary shelter, and we are deeply grateful to the City of Oxnard for its continued support in making that possible.

Casa de Carmen represents a first for the City of Oxnard: a site that combines emergency shelter and permanent supportive housing in one central location. Leasing and move-ins for the housing units are expected to begin in August, with the shelter component gradually filling in starting in September.

Nestled in the heart of the city, this innovative model will allow clients not only to find refuge, but to build a foundation for a brighter future—all under one roof. We look forward to celebrating this milestone with the community and continuing our mission to end homelessness, one life at a time.

CASA ALIENTO- OXNARD

Exciting progress is underway at Casa Aliento in Oxnard as we begin Phase 2 move-ins! Last fall, we welcomed home the first 32 residents in Phase 1, marking a major milestone in our mission to provide stable, supportive housing in our community. Now, over the coming weeks, we're preparing to fill the remaining 37 units, completing this transformative project.

As we welcome these new residents, we're seeking community support to help them start this new chapter with dignity. Our Welcome Home Basket Drive is underway, and we invite you to join us in providing essential items—like towels, kitchenware, toiletries, and cleaning supplies—that make a house feel like home.

Together, we can ensure every resident at Casa Aliento begins their journey with the warmth and support they deserve.
