MERCY HOUSE IMPACT: STATS FOR 2023-2024

- In the last year Mercy House ended homelessness for 3,907 people
- 1,052 people exited emergency shelter for permanent or temporary housing
- 381 disabled and chronically homeless individuals were provided housing and services

VENTURA COUNTY IMPACT: STATS FOR 2023-2024

- 375 homeless individuals were provided emergency shelter and services
- 44 people exited emergency shelter for permanent or temporary housing
- 15 households secured housing through our Oxnard Rapid Rehousing Program
- 100% of those served with Rapid Rehousing remained in permanent housing at exit

THE ARCH VENTURA

As of late July, we have 23 clients prioritized on the Pathways to Home List through the COC. 9 of our ARCH clients have been matched and are waiting for their units to be ready. 6 additional guests will be presented at the next Continuum of Care presentation meeting.

Thanks to the City of Ventura and San Buenaventura Housing Authority's efforts to expand low income and affordable housing, many of our clients will soon be on their way back home.

OXNARD NAVIGATION CENTER

OXNC is our largest shelter in Ventura County, serving 110 clients! Our Housing Navigation team at OXNC has been hard at work collaborating with clients and community partners to get clients housed. In just the last month 6 clients have been housed with many more getting ready to be presented at the next Continuum of Care meeting!

Oxnard is making progress toward
completion of construction. The
Continuum of Care has begun
matching people to units,
beginning the leasing process.
We anticipate 30 people to begin
